

BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS & SAFETY MEETING
May 5, 2025 – 5:30PM
Second Floor, City Building, 201 S. Union Street

Mayor Kamron Yates opened the meeting at 5:30 p.m. Those present rose for the Pledge of Allegiance. The meeting was livestreamed on YouTube.

Clerk-Treasurer Julie Price did roll call. Those present were Mayor Yates, Breanna Maxwell, and Spencer Kingery.

The minutes of April 21, 2025 meeting were presented for review. There were no additions or corrections. Motion to approve minutes as read by Spencer Kingery seconded by Breanna Maxwell. Minutes were approved as read and carried. (3-0)

The next order of business was regular claims for May 5, 2025 totaling \$260,849.92. Motion to accept and approve the claims made by Spencer Kingery, seconded by Breanna Maxwell. Motion carried and passed. (3-0)

Unfinished Business:

CCMG 2025-1 Recommendation to award bids was presented to the board by Dave Buck. Bid recommendation was reported with no errors and requiring all components. The recommendation to award the CCMG 2025-1 bid to Reith-Riley for \$1,379,943.40 was presented to the board for approval. Motion to approve award bid for CCMG 2025-1 to Reith-Riley made by Spencer Kingery and seconded by Breanna Maxwell. Motion carried and passed. (3-0)

2025 Pavement Preservation project(micro-surfacing) recommendation for bid award for the project was presented for approval to Pavement Solutions, Inc. Motion to approve the recommendation bid award for the project to Pavement Solutions, INC. made by Spencer Kingery, seconded by Breanna Maxwell. Motion carried and passed. (3-0)

New Business:

NIPSCO excavation permit request for the 407 S. Heritage Dr. was presented for approval. Motion to approve the permit made by Breanna Maxwell, seconded by Spencer Kingery. Motion carried and passed. (3-0)

NIPSCO excavation permit request for 101 Riley Road was presented for approval. Motion to approve the permit made by Spencer Kingery, seconded by Breanna Maxwell. Motion carried and passed. (3-0)

Future Business and announcements:

Mayor Yates thanked the DPD, chief Mullin, and street dept. for their efforts to make the little league parade successful once again this year. He also thanked the little league board for their assistance with the planning of the parade.

Mayor Yates announced that the city of Delphi hosted the first Mayor's Roundtable. He thanked the Canal, Mitchell's Tex Mex Grill, Julia Leahy, and Clerk-Treasurer Price for their part in helping with the roundtable to make it a successful event.

Spring Clean up was held May 3rd to help citizens clean up their property and rid of unwanted items and to help property owners meet city regulations and ordinances by picking up excess items needing to be thrown out.


Clerk-Treasurer Comments/Requests:


Public Comment:
