

BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS & SAFETY MEETING
November 17, 2025 – 5:30PM
Second Floor, City Building, 201 S. Union Street

Mayor Kamron Yates opened the meeting at 5:30 p.m. Those present rose for the Pledge of Allegiance. The meeting was livestreamed on YouTube.

Clerk-Treasurer Julie Price called the roll. Present were Spencer Kingery, Breanna Maxwell, and Mayor Yates.

The minutes of the November 3, 2025 meeting were presented for review. With no questions, changes, or discussion the motion to approve the minutes as read made by Breanna Maxwell, seconded by Spencer Kingery. Minutes were approved as read and motion carried and passed. (3-0)

The next order of business was regular claims for November 17, 2025 totaling \$757,259.66. Motion to accept the claims made by Spencer Kingery, second by Breanna Maxwell. Spencer Kingery made note that the higher claim amount was due to the fire territory transferring \$350,000.00 from the high yield money market to a CD. Clerk-treasurer Price explained it was simply for documentation purposes and the additional \$350,000.00 was not actually spent but put into a CD so there needs to be a paper trail. Excavation permit for 208 N. Robinson St. for Hammons development was presented for review and approval. The parade will begin at Monroe Street in front of the Pentecostal Sanctuary building. Julia confirmed there would be coordination with the street dept. and superintendent Lyons. Motion to approve the parade date, route, time, and location made by Spencer Kingery, seconded by Breanna Maxwell. Motion carried and passed. (3-0)




